



Set in medieval Italy, Rossini's rarely performed *Adelaide di Borgogna* is based on dramatic historical events that led to Otto the Great (Ottone) of Germany conquering the Kingdom of Italy. Despite its political and warlike subject, *Adelaide di Borgogna* is full of beautiful music, Rossini using lyrical moments to emphasise emotions and express the triangle of passionate love and rivalry between Adelaide, Ottone and Adelberto. *Adelaide* is *bel canto* in its purest form and was held in high regard by its composer, who recycled much of it in his subsequent operas.

Key Features:

- Our highly successful releases of recordings from the annual Rossini in Wildbad festival have included hits such as *Guillaume Tell* (8.660363-66), "probably as fine an achievement as any in the festival's 25-year history" (*Gramophone*), and less well-known works such as *Mose in Egitto* (8.660220-21), performed "with just the right amount of spirit and reverence that is the essence of Rossini's music" (*MusicWeb International*). *Adelaide di Borgogna* can be classed as something of a rarity, with only sporadic concert performances over recent decades. This 2014 production is the first to have been staged in Germany.
- This production's strong cast of singers is led in the title role by Ekaterina Sadovnikova, a winner at the International Competition in Dresden in 2006 and the Elena Obraztsova International Competition. The transvestite part of Ottone is taken by contralto Margarita Gritskova.
- Conductor Luciano Acocella has numerous acclaimed opera recordings and productions to his name, including Bellini's Capuleti e i Montecchi on the Dynamic label: "The leadership of Luciano Acocella is warm and tasteful, and the dramatic elements are as clear as the lyrical." (ClassicsToday.com)

The Camerata Bach Choir, Poznań was founded in 2003 by Tomasz Potkowski in Poznań. The members are for the most part soloists from the Poznań Opera chorus and the Kraków Philharmonic. The choir collaborates closely with the Wrocław Philharmonic, and has served as ensemble in residence for the Rossini in Wildbad Festival since 2010.

The Virtuosi Brunensis chamber orchestra was established in 2007 from two of the best known Czech orchestras, the Brno Janáček Theatre Orchestra and the Brno Philharmonic. Under its artistic director Karel Mitáš the orchestra has appeared, among other engagements, at the Bad Hersfeld Opera Festival and at the Rossini in Wildbad Festival, where it has recorded operas including Rossini's Otello, L'Italiana in Algeri, Semiramide and Guillaume Tell, Vaccaj's La sposa di Messina and Mercadante's I briganti for Naxos.





Premièred in 1946, a year after the end of World War II, Copland's iconic *Third Symphony* was described by the composer as 'a wartime piece – or, more accurately, an end-of-war piece – intended to reflect the euphoric spirit of the country at the time.' The fourth movement, heard on this recording in its original uncut form, opens by quoting one of his most well-known pieces, *Fanfare for the Common Man*. Copland described the *Three Latin American Sketches* 'as being just what the title says. The tunes, the rhythms and the temperament of the pieces are folksy, while the orchestration is bright and snappy and the music sizzles along.'

Key Features:

- Leonard Slatkin and the Detroit Symphony have embarked on an extensive collaboration on Copland's music.
- Previous releases of ballet music includes Hear Ye! Hear Ye! and Appalachian Spring (8.559806) and Rodeo (8.559758) have gained critical acclaim, like MusicWeb International Recording of the Year award for both discs.
- Of 8.559806 Gramophone wrote: "Slatkin's new interpretation is vigorous and communicative, and the playing is distinguished too."

Leonard Slatkin is Music Director of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra (DSO) and the Orchestre National de Lyon (ONL). He also maintains a rigorous schedule of guest conducting throughout the world and is active as a composer, author, and educator. Slatkin's more than a hundred recordings have received seven GRAMMY® awards and 64 nominations. His Naxos recordings include works by Saint-Saëns, Ravel, and Berlioz (with the ONL) and music by Copland, Rachmaninov, Borzova, McTee, and John Williams (with the DSO).

Heitor VILLA-LOBOS (1887–1959) Symphonies Nos. 8, 9 and 11

São Paulo Symphony Orchestra Isaac Karabtchevsky

By the 1940s Heitor Villa-Lobos was widely recognised as Latin America's greatest composer. Working in the United States gave him new perspectives, and his later symphonies move away from the folk influences and exotic effects of works written in the 1920s and 30s, such as the *Bachianas Brasileiras*, towards more concise, sometimes neo-classical, models. The *Eighth* and *Ninth* share a transparent lightness of touch while the *Eleventh*, described as a work of 'immediate charm', is the perfect introduction to the later work of Villa-Lobos.

Key Features:

- This is the fifth volume in our complete edition of Villa-Lobos' symphonies with the São Paulo Symphony Orchestra conducted by Isaac Karabtchevsky, and therefore already has (OSESP) conducted by Isaac Karabtchevsky, and therefore already has the advantage of having a series of distinguished predecessors. Volume 1 (8.573043) was already seen as being superior to its main competitor on the CPO label by Gramophone, "Karabtchevsky makes Villa-Lobos's zig-zagging, lopsided melodic line sound as boldly and brashly sculpted as Mount Rushmore... what merely sounds ungainly and idiomatically clumsy in St Clair's hands becomes musically engaged here."
- Volume 4 appeared in April 2015 and was given 5 stars by Pizzicato: "This is one spectacular and fascinating CD. Villa-Lobos's music, deeply rooted in the Brazilian tradition, is so full of imagination that one is stunned by the succession of musical ideas. Conducted by Isaac Karabtchevsky, the São Paulo Symphony Orchestra gives us an idiomatic and thrilling reading of the three works."
- This recording is the result of an intense process of revision and correction of the scores carried out by the performers concerned, together with OSESP's editorial team. The project was launched in 2011 by the orchestra's publishing branch (Criadores do Brasil) under the general guidance of Maestro Karabtchevsky.



Born in São Paulo in 1934, Isaac Karabtchevsky studied conducting and composition in Germany under Wolfgang Fortner, Pierre Boulez and Carl Ueter. Between 1969 and 1994 he led the Brazilian Symphony Orchestra (OSB), and between 1995 and 2001 he was musical director of the La Fenice Theatre in Venice. He was also artistic director of the Porto Alegre Symphony Orchestra in Brazil, of the São Paulo Municipal Theatre, of the Orchestre National des Pays de la Loire in France, and of the Tonkünstler Orchestra in Vienna. He was awarded the Cultural Merit medal by the Austrian government and was made Chevalier des Arts et des Lettres by the French government, as well as being honoured by virtually every province in Brazil.







The second Naxos recording by the elite conservatory students of the National Orchestral Institute Philharmonic explores further examples of the breadth of American music. Randall Thompson, famed for his vocal works, is represented by his *Symphony No. 2* which, with its syncopation and echoes of jazz, helped to establish a bright, vibrant American style. After an inauspicious debut, Samuel Barber's tautly cyclical *Symphony No. 1* became the first American symphonic piece to be performed at the Salzburg Festival. Samuel Adams offers a contemporary voice in *Drift and Providence*, which spectacularly captures the sound of the Pacific Ocean by incorporating electronic elements.

Key Features:

James Ross

- The first disc was on 8.559782 and contained Corigliano's Symphony No.1 along with works by Michael Torke and Aaron Copland.
- Of the first volume Gramophone wrote: "such a polished, expressively pointed performance as this [Corigliano's Symphony No. 1] was made in a single day in June 2015 by an ad hoc orchestra of pre-professional players is mightily impressive."
- This new disc includes *Drift and Providence* by rising star **Samuel** (not John!) **Adams**.
- Barber's many Naxos discs should be pushed but perhaps more so Randall Thompson's as he is much less well-known – his *Requiem* is on 8.559789.

Alessandro Scarlatti was largely responsible for developing early Neapolitan opera but his son Domenico journeyed to Lisbon and then to Madrid where he entered the service of the royal family. It was primarily for the Infanta Maria Barbara, who became Queen of Spain in 1746, that Domenico Scarlatti wrote his celebrated single-movement sonatas, some of the greatest pieces in eighteenth-century keyboard repertoire. This volume reveals Scarlatti's evocations of Spanish dance rhythms, vivid exploration of colour, scintillating scales and arpeggios and striking echo effects.

Key Features:

- Domenico Scarlatti's 555 (or so) sonatas have provided a tremendous repertoire for keyboard players over many years. There are boxed set editions of a large number of the sonatas currently available by single artists, such as Richard Lester on Nimbus, and Gilbert Rowland on Kingdom, and Pieter-Jan Belder on Brilliant Classics. This Naxos series is different, and has been parceled out to different pianists.
- Pianist Goran Filipec recorded volume 42 of the Liszt Complete Piano Music edition for Naxos (8.573458), which won the 2016 Ferenc Liszt Society Grand Prix du Disque. It is also a *MusicWeb International* 'Recording of the Month': "The playing throughout these very difficult pieces is top notch; I cannot fault Mr. Filipec's virtuosity or musical feeling at any point. The playing is superb in every respect."

Goran Filipec was born in Rijeka in 1981 and showed considerable early musical talent. After completing his studies in Croatia at the Academy Ino Mirkovich he continued at the Cologne Musikhochschule, the Moscow Tchaikovsky State Conservatory and at the Royal Conservatory in The Hague. He is a laureate of several international piano competitions, including the Concorso Internazionale Franz Liszt – Premio Mario Zanfi (Italy), the Concurso de Piano Parnassos (Mexico), the José Iturbi International Music Competition (USA) and the Gabala International Piano Competition (Azerbaijan). His Naxos recording of Liszt's Paganini Studies [8.573458] was awarded the prestigious Grand Prix du Disque of the Budapest Ferenc Liszt Society, previous winners of which have included Vladimir Horowitz, György Cziffra, Alfred Brendel, Claudio Arrau, Zoltán Kocsis and Maurizio Pollini.

Based on stories by Henri Merger but also infused with the composer's own experiences as a penniless graduate, Puccini's powerful opera *La Bohème* portrays its youthful characters' romantic outlook on life and the brutally tragic end to their innocence. The story is set around 1830 but director Orpha Phelan sees Puccini's characters as equally at home in our times: "their story is universal, all that is needed is to understand what it is like to be young and in love!" This Malmö production was acclaimed in the *Svenska Dagbladet* as "one of the most moving renditions of Puccini's opera I have ever seen".

Key Features:

- This DVD and Blu-ray release captures the 2014 Malmö Opera production of La Bohème, acclaimed Irish director Orpha Phelan's third with this company. The production brings Puccini's famous bohemians into the present day, emphasizing the universal nature of young lives and tragedies while also picking up on today's issues of urban poverty and gentrification.
- Colorful and attractively dynamic in its use of distinctive Parisian carousels as stage sets, this production was received to great acclaim. Skanska Dagbladet remarked on "outstanding performances in both singing and acting. The audience responded with ovations to tear down the theatre. Malmö Opera's La Bohème is a hit!"
- Blogger Yiannis Gabriel also wrote "Modern dress works extremely well in this production, mostly colourful and punkish, but drainpipe blue jeans and cheap puffer jacket for Mimi. The effect in the last act, when Musetta removes Mimi's old tennis shoes to reveal the bloodied newspaper padding with which she has tried to keep her feet warm had many in the audience gasp loudly. When you have a singer as thin and graceful as Olesya Golovneva in the role of Mimi, singing with unerring musicality and passion if not the most glamorous of voices, the effect of her death is tremendous."

Conductor Christian Badea has received exceptional acclaim throughout his career, encompassing prestigious engagements in the foremost concert halls and opera houses of Europe, North America, and Asia. Among the opera houses where Christian Badea has guest conducted are the Royal Opera House at



Covent Garden in London, the Metropolitan Opera in New York, the Bayerische Staatsoper in Munich, Vienna State Opera, the Netherlands Opera in Amsterdam and many more. Maestro Badea's repertoire encompasses more than 100 operas with particular emphasis on the works of Mozart, Strauss, Wagner, Verdi, Puccini, Mussorgsky, as well as those of 20th century composers such as Prokofiev, Shostakovich, Janacek, Britten, Berg and Samuel Barber. He has conducted extensively the Italian and French repertoire, collaborating with the most important singers of the last two decades.

Thoughts Observed

SCHUMANN · DUPARC · DEBUSSY · HAHN · POULENC

Yaniv d'Or, Countertenor Dan Deutsch, Piano

After exploring the music of his Sephardic ancestry on the acclaimed recording *Latino Ladino* (Naxos 8.573566), Yaniv d'Or brings a refreshing perspective to the *Dichterliebe* from Schumann's proverbial 'year of song'. French songs of the 19th and 20th centuries offer d'Or's exotic voice further dimensions in the floating harmonies of the young Duparc and Debussy, including Reynaldo Hahn's beautiful Bach pastiche, and concluding with the classical simplicity of Poulenc's first songs.

Key Features:

- This release follows the huge success of Yaniv D'Or's first album for Naxos, Latino Ladino (8.573566), which was acclaimed by The Huffington Post as "achingly personal and exquisitely lyrical... what makes these ancient reflections on beauty, love, joy and sorrow so profoundly expressive of basic human feelings and needs is Yaniv d'Or's haunting, vulnerable countertenor," Gramophone also admiring his "rich, honeyed falsetto."
- Schumann's Dichterliebe is his best-known song cycle, and with a recording history that includes legendary artists such as Dietrich Fischer-Dieskau and Gérard Souzay this might seem like a daring choice, but Yaniv D'Or's remarkable range allows him to use the versions of these songs in keys normally used for a bass voice, fearlessly performing them an octave higher to give them an additional layer of drama and uniquely distinctive beauty.
- Yaniv d'Or is accompanied by Dan Deutsch, a pianist with an enviable reputation as a chamber musician and recitalist in Germany, Israel, Switzerland, Austria, and beyond, and a laureate of numerous Lieder competitions.

The unique countertenor voice of Yaniv d'Or has confirmed his status as one of the rising stars of the modern international music scene. He studied at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama in London, receiving the International Vocal Art Institution Prize and the Gottesman Award. Making his début as Tolomeo in *Giulio Cesare* for Gothenberg Opera, and at the Teatro dell'Opera di Roma as Elbaz in *Journey to the End of the Millennium* by Bardanashvili, he received critical acclaim. He has performed widely throughout Europe, has appeared in recital at Versailles Palace and regularly appears at Wigmore Hall. Recent highlights include concerts with the Israel Philharmonic and Israeli Opera. He is the recipient of a *Gramophone* Award for his album *Liquefacta Est...* with Ensemble NAYA on Naxos.

Accomplished pianist **Dan Deutsch** studied at the University for Music and Performing in Vienna and the University of Music and Theatre in Hamburg, and is a graduate of the Tel Aviv Music Academy. He has won the Paula Salomon-Lindberg Competition, the Ronen Fund, and the America-Israel Cultural Foundation's Outstanding Artist prize. Deutsch appears regularly in recitals and chamber music at major international concert halls. His recent engagements include performing at the Philharmonie in Berlin, the Ruhr Essen Piano Festival and the Israel Festival. Dan Deutsch collaborates with various singers and records with leading orchestras. This is his first recording for Naxos.



Bechara El-Khoury's work often refers to his native Lebanon, and *Orages* (Storms) takes us back to youthful memories of nature's chaotic moods, from flashes of lightning via sinister darkness to surreal and luminous calm. *Espaces-Fragmentations* reflects on time and 'a strange journey into night', while *Poème nocturne* marks the life of renowned French flautist Jean-Pierre Rampal. The lyrical post-Romantic style of *Le Chant d'amour* at times evokes the spirit of Richard Strauss.

Key Features:

- This recording covers several distinguished French orchestras and involves renowned conductors such as Paavo Järvi and Daniele Gatti. The soloists are also highly regarded musicians. Multi award-winning flautist Vicens Prats has been principal solo flautist with the Orchestre de Paris since 1991 and is a former student of Jean-Pierre Rampal, and acclaimed soprano Ariane Douguet has been unanimously hailed by the press for her "rare voice", "rich and moving timbre", "cultivated musicality", "superb attitude" and the "dramatic intensity" of her interpretations.
- Le Chant d'amour which sets a poem by the great French poet
 Lamartine, represents something of a stylistic departure: "a
 different aspect of my music," and one which explores further
 El-Khoury's great admiration for the music of Richard Strauss.
 As ever, El-Khoury's success is both in his fertile imagination and
 superb feel for orchestral color. This new recording is very much
 the equal of its predecessors in this regard and is sure to have
 wide appeal.
- This is our sixth release of works by Bechara El-Khoury, in this case consisting entirely of world première recordings. While world events such as the First Lebanese War (Les Ruines de Beyrouth, Le Liban en flammes, Requiem, Naxos 8.557043 & 8557691), 9/11 (New York Tears and Hope, Naxos 8.570134) and the Shoah (War Concerto) have in the past inspired El-Khoury to reflect and meditate on the human condition, several of his more recent works (Autumn Pictures, The Dark Mountains, Naxos 8.572773) reveal the influence on his musical inspiration of landscape and the natural world, and this new release represents an extension of these ideas.

Paavo Järvi is currently chief conductor of the NHK Symphony Orchestra and artistic director of the Deutsche Kammerphilharmonie. He is the founder of the Estonian Festival Orchestra. He is also conductor laureate of the Frankfurt Radio Symphony Orchestra, music director laureate of the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra and artistic



adviser to the Estonian National Symphony Orchestra. In addition to his permanent positions, Järvi is much in demand as a guest conductor, appearing regularly with world-class orchestras, such as the Berlin Philharmonic and the Philharmonia Orchestra, London. As a GRAMMY® Award-winning artist, Paavo Järvi is one of the most prolific recording conductors of today with a discography of widely ranging repertoire.

François Devienne performed as an orchestral bassoonist and flautist but rose to fame as an operatic composer. His greatest achievement, however, lies in his sequence of Flute Concertos, of which this is the final volume. Despite his failing health, the four works on this recording demonstrate the hallmark combination of melodic elegance and graceful virtuosity that characterises Devienne's flute concertos, and are among the most attractive of their time. Concerto No. 10 is one of his masterpieces, distinguished equally by the beauty of its thematic material and its confident, cohesive musical structure.



Alejandro Román is one of Spain's most eclectic and versatile composers. He has been influenced by jazz and popular music, and this disc charts many facets of his unique compositional style. The sonically alluring *Diégesis* incorporates melodic motifs from ancient Greece in a theatrical context. *Trois Tableaux Français* owes its inspiration to Debussy and Impressionism, whilst *Homenaje a Bartók* uses a Hungarian scale in Román's tribute to another of his favourite composers. In its repetitive movement, the suite *Zootropías* evokes early cinematic devices.

- As a jazz and rock performer some years ago, Alejandro Román recorded numerous discs and he has a YouTube presence; his appeal is broader than the usual classical arena.

The people of Poland have lived through often impossible conditions over the last three centuries, and this album is Polish-American composer Mark Nowakowski's tribute to their spirit of survival. Songs of Forgiveness is both a meditation on anger and grief and a lamentation on the stark realities of a society riven by tragedy. Blood, Forgotten is a multimedia memorial for the victims of Nazi and Soviet aggression during World War II, the electronic soundtrack using sounds from an instrument that survived one of the concentration camps. Partly written as a memorial for Henryk Górecki, Grandfather Songs also includes the surreal element of a recording of Nowakowski's family singing the war song Hej Ulani.


Key Features:

- One of the most acclaimed young string quartets in the US, the Voxare String Quartet has appeared before on Naxos as part of an album of music by Paul Moravec (8.559797), "another Moravec highpoint" (Percorsi Musicali). Pulitzer Prize-winning composer Ned Rorem has stated that "the Voxare String Quartet is probably the best American chamber group performing today." Voxare was awarded Chamber Music America's ASCAP Award for Adventurous Programming, and has performed at major venues in the US and abroad, including as soloists with the New York Philharmonic at Avery Fisher Hall. - Blood, Forgotten is an album of music written by rising young Polish-American composer Mark Nowakowski and performed by the Voxare String Quartet. The title refers to the little-known atrocities suffered by Poles during World War II and the following Soviet occupation. Nowakowski uses as inspiration songs sung by his family during these dark times, and in fact samples an audio recording of this singing in



his *String Quartet No. 2*, "Grandfather Songs." The album contains Nowakowski's two string quartets (the first written for and premièred by Voxare and the second premièred by the Kronos Quartet), a lullaby for string quartet based on an ancient Polish folk song, and the eponymous work for solo violin and electronics.

A native of Inner Mongolia, Wenchen Qin grew up with the folk music of his homeland and is now one of China's most influential composers. His violin concerto *The Border of the Mountains* exploits the extraordinary colours and flexibility of both orchestra and soloist, echoing nature and the songs and spirituality of the mountains. Each movement of the cello concerto *Dawn* is based on a fragment of text by the poet Hai Zi, while *Calling for Phoenix*, inspired by the series of paintings *Phoenix in Fire* by Xiao-he Tang and Li Cheng, is an intensely virtuosic concerto for suona, a traditional double-reed instrument.

Key Features:

This release presents three world première recordings of one of China's most important composers – **Wenchen Qin**. Each work is a concerto, excitingly conjoining the well-established established Western tradition of soloist and orchestra with a world that draws directly on Chinese folksong and poetry. The uniquely distinctive use of the double-reed suona in *Calling for Phoenix* is another big attraction.

Each of the soloists on this recording is highly distinguished in their field. Violinist **Mengla Huang** performs regularly with the world's leading orchestras, also having won the First Prize at the Premio Paganini International Violin Competition in Italy in 2002 as well as First Prize in the Sendai International Music Competition in 2001.

- Cellist Li-Wei Qin has appeared all over the world as a soloist and as a chamber musician.
 "Li-Wei drew the audience in with his artistry, his brilliant virtuosity and his very refined musicality and sincerity of interpretation" was the description of his performance at the 11th Tchaikovsky International Competition where he was awarded the Silver Medal. He also won the First Prize in the prestigious 2001 Naumburg Competition in New York.
- Qianyuan Zhang is a famous suona performer who received China's top music award the Golden Bell gold medal at the age of twenty, and received the highest Chinese government music award the Wenhua Prize gold medal when she was very young. Her extraordinary performances have made her the only double gold medal winner in her field.
- Conductor Gottfried Rabl a specialist in contemporary music and has recorded highly successful releases of new Chinese music for Naxos such as Xu Shuya's Nirvana (8.570617) and Deqing Wen's Shanghai Prelude (8.570619).



In recent years a number of composers have explored the tonal chemistry of timbre and texture offered by the ensemble of cello and guitar. The examples here, from South America and Eastern Europe, are among the most ambitious and technically demanding yet to have been written. American classical guitarist Xavier Jara has taken first prize at numerous international competitions, including the prestigious 2016 GFA International Concert Artist Competition. This release stands out not only for the sheer musicality and technical brilliance of the performer, but for his imaginatively structured and adventurous programme. It balances the poetic beauty of John Dowland and Alan Rawthorne with the broad appeal of Castelnuovo-Tedesco's Variations across the Centuries, technically challenging works by Dušan Bogdanović, as well as intriguing discoveries such as young composer Jeremy Collins's Elegy.

Key Features:

This exceptionally fine addition to the Naxos 'Guitar Laureate' series has come about as the result of American classical guitarist Xavier Jara winning first prize in the 2016 GFA International Concert Artist Competition. He has previously had successes in a number of international competitions including 1st prize in the



2012 Andrés Segovia competition in Velbert Germany, 1st prize at the international guitar competition of Viseu (Portugal), 1st prize at the Sinaia international guitar competition in Romania, at the Boston Guitarfest (2014), the Gargnano, Italy Competition (2015) and the Tokyo International Competition (2016). In 2016 Xavier Jara returned home to the United States to win the Guitar Foundation of America's Rose Augustine Grand Prize.






